CITY TAXI RATES

Taxi fares within Greensboro city limits, fixed by law, follow: 35¢ first passenger, 15¢ second passenger, and 10¢ for each additional passenger. Soldiers, if you are charged more, take the cab license number, the number on the cab, the name of the cab company, and if the driver won't give you his name, jot down the time you dismissed the cab. Then, turn in this information, together with your names, to the Provost Marshal's office. Appropriate action will be taken by the civilian police.

ATTENTION, JEEPS!

Trainees and casuals are not permitted to wear the Air Forces sleeve patch. Only permanent party members and EM assigned to the Air Corps are entitled to use this insignia.

NEW SERVICE CENTER

The First Presbyterian Church has opened a Servicemen's Lounge at 617 North Elm Street. Open from 4 to 10 p.m. daily, it provides refreshments and cigarettes. Pretty hostesses are in attendance.

ANOTHER CENTER

The Presbyterian Church, Walker Avenue, and Mendenhall St., has opened another center. This center, which offers food in addition to attractive girls to talk with, is to be open Sundays from 4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

STILL ANOTHER

Another service center has been opened in Greensboro. It's at the Temple Emanuel, 717 N. Greene St., and offers writing facilities, reading matter and ping pong tables. The center is open Tues. 8 to 11 p.m., Fri. 9 to 10:30 p.m. and Sat. 8 to 11 p.m.
