Not long ago 60,000 people, it was simuted, were buried by the earthquake which destroyed Mendoza; 40,000 perished at Quito in 1797; 60,000 at Lisbon 1755; 71,000 at Messina in 1692; 300,000 by two earthquakes at Antioch in the sixth and seventh centuries; 120,000 in Syria in the first century, and 50,000 in the same country upon another occasion; a catastro-phe in Mexico carried off 10,000 persons; and one in Calabria, 40,000.
