Silos, or receptacles for the preservation by partial fermentation, under pressure, of green forage crops in a succulent, appetizing and digestible condition (Ensilage), may be made either in the ground or above it. The writer will, after giving the important general features of any good Silo, attempt to describe, as simply and clearly as possible, the method of constructing one of each variety, so as to meet the requirements of farmers




