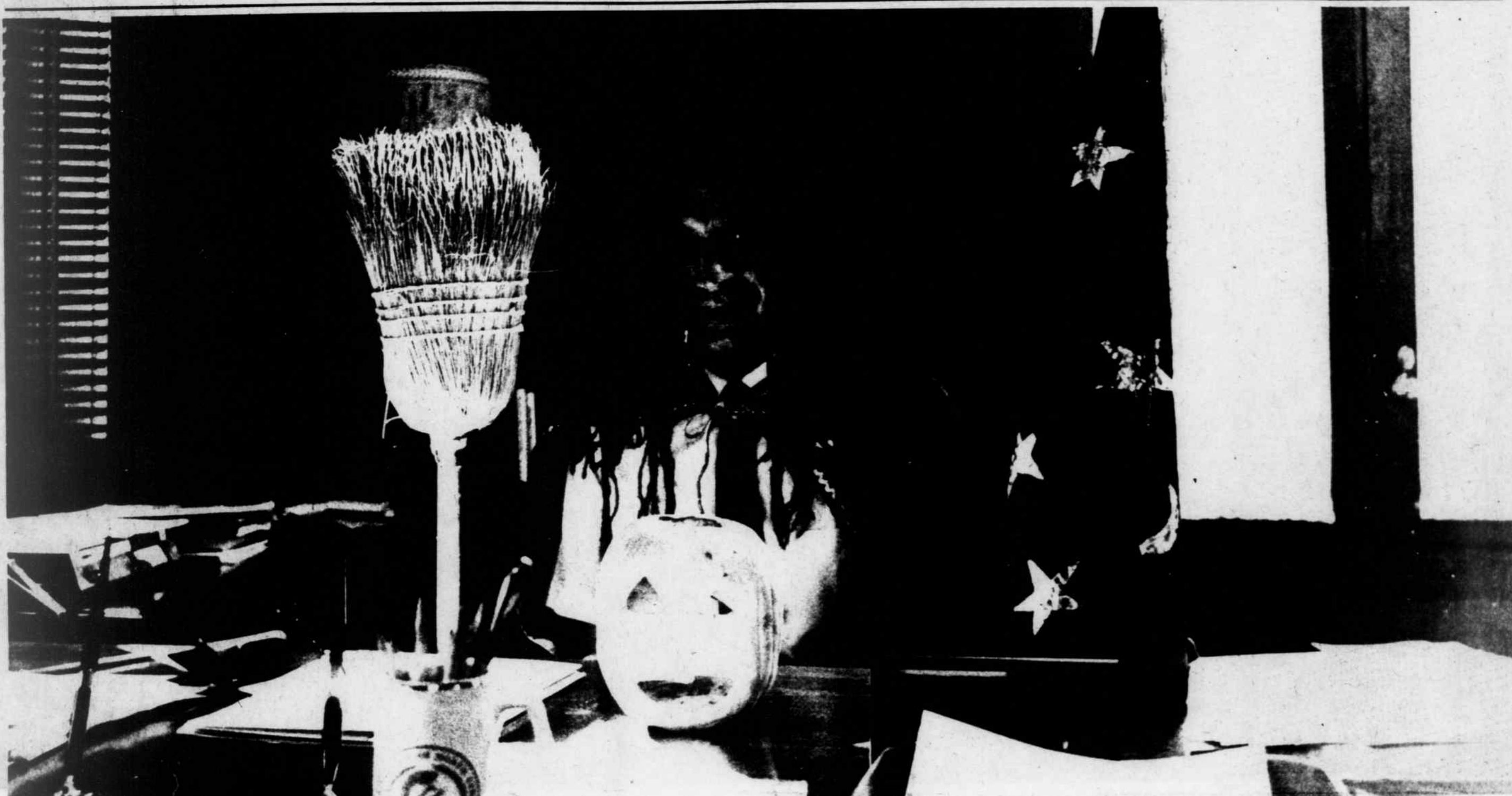

## Exam May Show Life In Danger

Since the culmination of the regular physical education classes, physical examinations for all students are being given in the gym by the physical education faculty. Miss Holp Tisdale is head of the corrective and examining work.

In discussing the exams, Miss Tisdale states that in general the condition of students' feet is rather bad. However, they are wearing better shoes than formerly, and there is hope of improvement.

A minute record is made of each girl that comes in or out of the examining rooms, and her future gym work more or less depends on it. Extreme cases of poor condition are recorded for corrective work under Miss Tisdale. This includes work for posture and feet which has its beginning in removing the cause of the condition. She is careless and unmindful of how she looks going across campus and elsewhere, but when put in front of a mirror and told how to improve

her posture, she usually does so very readily. Further corrective work includes exercises to strengthen weak muscles and follow-up work.

The physical exam is composed of two parts. One is the orthopedic record that is concerned principally with posture. The other is the anthropometric record which includes: age, height, weight, chest expansion, vital capacity, and shoulder and hip breadth.

As a student leaves the examining rooms one of four cards is given her as a reminder or check-up. If the card is red, she is fifteen pounds or more below the average weight for her height and there is danger ahead. A blue card denotes she is ten pounds underweight. A slate card notifies her she is overweight, and a white one congratulates her on being normal. In each case the cards give suggestions and instructions for possible improvements.

## Swartz Tops Select Group

The administration announced the annual selection of "Who Them" Monday and a spokesman reported that this year's list is the "most star-studded aggregation of student leaders UNC-G has ever produced."

Topping the list is Marvin Swartz. Marvin, his mother calls him Sonny, is a business major from Four Holes Swamp.
