- I. Acclaim God in all lands!
 Let all that in Heaven and Earth
 has been created
 exalt His glory;
 and we wish to bring our God
 an offering too,
 because in affliction and need
 He has always stood by us.
- II. We make offering at the temple where God's honor dwells, where His constancy each day afresh rewards us with pure blessing. We glorify what He has done for us. Although the mouths are feeble which babble of His wonders, even such poor praise can be pleasing to Him.
- III. Most High, make Thy goodness shine anew each morning. So for that Fatherly constancy, a grateful heart may show through godly living that we are Thy children.
- IV. Glory, laud, and honor be to God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
 Who would increase in us that which He promised out of Grace, that we may firmly trust in Him, wholly depend on Him, build on Him within our hearts, that our hearts and minds and souls may remain faithful to Him; now let us therefore sing:
 Amen, we will attain it; this we believe from the bottom of our hearts.
