Comprised of music and non-music major students on the graduate and undergraduate level, the **UNCG TUBABAND** has performed at many regional T.U.B.A (Tubists Universal Brotherhood Association) conferences, the 1995 and 1998 U.S. Army Tuba/Euphonium Conferences, the 1995 International T.U.B.A. Conference in Evanston, IL, the 1997 International Tuba and Euphonium Conference in Riva Del Garda, Italy, and has been invited to perform at the 1999 TubaMania Conference in Sydney, Australia. UNCG low brass students have been winners of School of Music competitions and many state, regional and international solo competitions. Additionally, several students have been selected as members in international tuba-euphonium ensembles. Each year, the TUBABAND plays host to North Carolina's largest TUBACHRISTMAS event, drawing over 125 tuba and euphonium players from Virginia, the coastal and mountain regions of North Carolina, as well as the piedmont to the UNCG campus.

Dennis W. AsKew currently serves as Director of Undergraduate Studies and Associate Professor of Tuba and Euphonium and Music Education at UNCG; prior to this he was Director of Bands at Cass High School in Cartersville, GA and Assistant Director of Bands at Bucknell University. Dr. AsKew was the first tubist to receive the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Tuba Performance from the University of Michigan, having received Bachelor and Master's degrees from the University of Georgia and Penn State University, respectively.

Since coming to UNCG, Dr. AsKew has been active as a performer, having given solo recitals throughout the east and southeast, and numerous concerts as a member of the Market Street Brass Quintet. He recently gave masterclasses for conservatory students in The Netherlands, and was a featured performer as part of the Dutch National Tuba/Euphonium Conference. Dr. AsKew has maintained an active participation in public school education by presenting workshops and masterclasses in many of the area high schools and middle schools, as well as leading masterclasses for state and regional music conferences.
